

## Lab I B – Game Box and GenAI

### This lab holds five goals:

1. Help you practice with Generative AI tools.
2. Apply your problem-solving skills.
3. Reflect on different ways of solving the same problem.
4. Have fun.
5. Add new reflections into your Dev Journal.

### 1 Problem Description - “Game Box”

- Yep, this time you will use GenAI Tools - except for answering the questions listed in this lab:
    - A note on using Grammar Checker tools such as Grammarly to answer reflection/textual questions like all the ones below: It is fine to use those as long as you DO NOT make use of generative AI features.
- 1) You will return to Lab 1 and choose three games from the Game Box.
  - 2) You will then select GenAI tools of your choice and interact with them to get a different solution to the three games.
  - 3) The goal is to build a new “Game Box” that has three games, but this time built as a result of your interaction with GenAI tools.

### 3. What to hand?

You will upload a pdf file only. In the pdf, the *team* will answer the questions below. Teams must collaboratively work on every single problem and questions – splitting tasks is not allowed.

- **You must use either Verdana, Tahoma, or Palatino Linotype (font-size 12 or 14).**
1. (2.0) Use this lab to reflect on and update your Dev Journal. In a few words, what did you add to your dev journal and why?
  2. (1.0) Which tools did you choose and why?
  3. (3.0) Which three games did you pick? And what have you built?
    - a. You will add images to contextualize your answer.
    - b. Make sure to add images that are easy to see!
    - c. Add explanatory, comprehensive captions below your images.
  4. (2.0) Reflecting on labs 1 and lab 1 B, how was your experience, and what did you learn? (Provide a comprehensive answer).
  5. (1.0) If you were to describe to a recruiter what you built and accomplished in labs 1 and 1B, what would you say? (Provide a comprehensive answer).
  6. (1.0) How effective/or not was the addition of a GenAI tool? (Chat with others in our class to learn from their experiences).
